
1984 ISGIDAR Business Meeting

After the paper session the annual business meeting was called to order by President Marilyn E. Carroll. She introduced the winner of the ISGIDAR travel award, Dr. Kohji Takada, and presented him with a certificate of award. His research concerning the aversive effects of drugs is being conducted at the University of Michigan. It was moved, seconded and approved by the membership that the award be continued a second year. An award notice is included in the newsletter. Dave Downs noted that we have roughly \$1,000 (within an order of magnitude) in the Treasury. Bill Woolverton noted that very few bibliographic forms are being submitted for the newsletter and again encouraged members to submit these. The next bibliography form is due in Janauary for inclusion in the February newsletter. Please note that format requirements for bibliographic citations have been relaxed in an attempt to reduce the response cost for putting citations together. After this discussion, the meeting was adjourned.

The meeting was well-attended, many good questions were asked, and I received many compliments on the quality of the papers. ISGIDAR Research Award for New Investigators

Award

Up to \$500 in reasonable and documented travel costs will be paid to the winner to attend the annual meeting of the Committee on Problems of Drug Dependence, 1985, and to attend and present a paper at the ISGIDAR satellite session. Payment will be made upon submission of travel receipts to the ISGIDAR Treasurer. Those who did not receive the award, but who did receive good reviews will be encouraged to present their papers at the ISGIDAR meeting.

Eligibility

Applicants must be enrolled in a graduate program and be working toward a doctorate or have received their doctorate within the last five years (after June 1, 1980).

If they are not ISGIDAR members applicants must be sponsored by an ISGIDAR member.

The research to be reported at ISGIDAR must not already be published.

Mansucript Requirements

Please submit 4 copies double spaced, not more than 10 pages excluding figures and references.

The length and scope of the paper should be consistent with a 20-25 minute slide presentation.

Please include paper title, name, address, phone number and author's signature on the cover page of the manuscript.

The signature and typed name of the author's sponsor should also appear on the cover page after a statement indicating that the applicant made a significant scientific contribution to the research.

Review

Each manuscript will be independently reviewed by the ISGIDAR officers, for originality, scientific contribution, sound methodology and clarity of the manuscript.

Blind review is possible upon request.

Reviewer's will not participate in the review of papers from their own institution.

Deadline

Manuscripts should comply with the requirements specified above and they must be submitted by March 1, 1985. Those postmarked after March 1st will not be considered. Applicants will be notified by April 15, 1985.
